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## HYSTEROSALPINGOGRAM (HSG)

1. What is an HSG? An HSG is an x-ray exam of the uterus and fallopian tubes where dye is injected to check for blockage of the tubes and/or abnormalities of the uterus.
2. When is it to be done? An HSG should be performed between days six and ten of your cycle (the day your menstrual period starts is day one).
3. How do I schedule an HSG? Call our office at 317-621-2312 the first day of your period. If the first day falls over the weekend, call the office on Monday. We will schedule the test at the hospital.
4. Will I experience discomfort or pain during this test? You may experience minor cramping, spotting, or abdominal distention after the test. You may take three tablets of advil/ibuprofen/motrin (total of 600 mg) one hour prior to your test and after as required every eight hours. If you experience fever, chills, or severe abdominal pain call the office immediately.
5. Where do I go for my test? Report to the radiology department at Community North Hospital (317-621-5069) 30 minutes prior to your test. You can pre-register by calling 317-355-3920.
6. How do I get results? We will call you as soon as we receive the radiologist's report

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
